## **RESPONSE TO**

## PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

The undersigned parties ("Parties") provide the following response to the Petition for Reconsideration ("PFR") filed by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials ("AASHTO") in the above-identified proceeding. The PFR urges reconsideration of certain FCC decisions in the 7<sup>th</sup> Report and Order in the proceeding<sup>1</sup> and adoption instead of a "Band Manager Light" approach to the 4.9 GHz band.

The Parties endorse many of the positions espoused by AASHTO in the PFR but are not persuaded that reconsideration of the 7<sup>th</sup> R&O is needed to achieve AASHTO's objectives. In their opinion, adoption of the recommendations in the Parties' Reply Comments submitted yesterday in response to the 9<sup>th</sup> FNPRM would address AASHTO's concerns without requiring a wholesale reconsideration of the 7<sup>th</sup> R&O and the attendant further delay in adopting final rules for this important band.
